

Chief King: Don't pass stopped school buses

So far this school year, 8 tickets issued within the town limits

When a school bus comes to a stop, nearby drivers have a choice to make — break the law, face a huge fine, receive driver's license/insurance points and possibly harm someone -

or to do the right thing. Seems like an easy choice, but some folks decide otherwise to risk everything to gain nothing. Since mid-August, eight tickets have been issued for motorists who've been charged with passing a stopped school bus with the town of Edenton — a number that is quite high for a town of about 5,000 souls, according to Police Chief Henry King Jr.

"One incident is too many," he said. "So if you simply don't want to hear from the police, then just don't pass a bus.'






Two-lane roadway with a center turning tame: When school bus stops for passer all traffic from both directions must stop

"Please understand that King said distracted driving when traveling at a certain

During a six-month period from August 2018 to March 2019, 12 children were killed and another 47 were injured while getting on and off school buses in the U.S., according to state statistics. Bus stop-arms were extended at the time, which means that in North Carolina and the 49 others, motorists were required to come to
