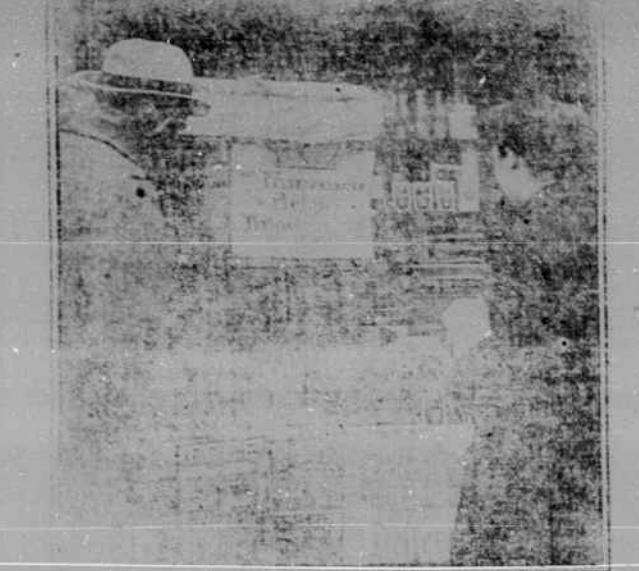
Mrs. H. N. Taylor is reported as recovering nicely from her recent illness.
