NOTICE FOR SPECIAL SCHOOL TAX ELECTION

At the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, N. C., on the 3rd day of March, 1924, a petition was presented to the said board, signed by more than one-third of the qualified voters of a certain boundary in School District No. 7, Murphy Township, Cherokee County, N. C., hereinafter described and set out, asking that an election be called by the said board for the purpose of voting for or against a Special School Tax of not more than thirty (30) cents on the hundred dollars worth of property and 90 cents on each taxable poll in said boundary, to supplement the public school fund which may be apportioned to said district by the County Board of Education.

It is ordered by the Board of County Commissioners in regular session on the 1st Monday, the 3rd of March, 1924, that an election be held under the laws and regulation of the General Election Laws of the State of North Carolina to be held at the regular voting place in school district No. 7, Murphy Township hereinafter set out on Saturday the 19th day of April, 1924, to vote for or against Special School Tax in the following territory, viz:

It being that boundary known as School District No. 7, in Murphy Township, and more particularly described as shown on the records in the office of the Board of Education for Cherokee County.

It is further ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County that O. C. Davis be appointed Registrar and George Lovingood and Theo. Lovingood judges for said election to be held in said boundary at the school house in said district.

It is further ordered that the Registrar's books be opened for said election on Saturday the 15th day of March, and each Saturday thereafter for four successive weeks, and

that a new registration of all voters be had, and Saturday the 19th day of April as challenge day.

At said election those in favor of said special school tax shall vote on a written or printed ticket of the usual size "For Special School Tax"; and those opposing said tax shall vote on a written or printed ticket of the usual size, "Against Special School Tax."

It is further ordered that said election be conducted and held in the same manner as the General Elections and that due returns be made of the said election to this Board.
