AN ORDINANCE.

Authorizing the issuance of one hundred thousand dollars, six percent electric light and power bonds of the town of Murphy, North Carolina.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina: Section 1. That for the purpose

of providing funds with which to increase the height of the concrete dam at the hydro-electric plant owned by the Town of Murphy on the Notli River and to make improvement, enlargements and additions to the said plant for the purpose of furnishing additional light and power for the use of the Town of Murphy and the inhabitants thereof; that negotiable coupon bonds of said town in an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) be issued and sold, the said bonds to bear interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent, payable semi-annually, and shall mature within the maximum period of thirty years and be issued in such form as the governing body of the Town may, by resolution, determine.

Section 2. That there shall be levied and collected annually a sufficient tax to pay the interest and principal of said bonds as they mature.

Section 3. That a statement of the debt of said municipality has been filed with the Clerk of the Municipality pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is open for inspection.

Section 4. That the probable period of usefulness of the improvements for which the bonds are to be issued is thirty years.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Murphy as provided by the Municipal Finance Act, and for the purpose of procuring the assent of the voters of said municipality, an election is hereby called to be held, in the manner and form prescribed by law, on the 10th day of July, 1924, and for the purpose of holding said election, T. W. Axley is appointed Registrar, and Sid Penley and H. D. Akin judges, and the registration books shall be kept open for the registration of new voters for the length of time prescribed by law. At said election, those voters favoring the issuance of bonds for the aforesaid purpose shall vote a ballot containing the words: "For ordinance authorizing \$100,000.00 bonds for providing funds for enlargements and additions to the hydro-electric plant upon Notli River, and a tax therefor," and those opposing the issuance of said bonds shall vote a ballot containing the words: "Against the ordinance authorizing \$100,000.00 of bonds for providing funds for enlargements and additions to the hydro-electric plant upon the Notli River, and a tax therefor." If upon canvass of the returns and declaration of the result of said election, it appears that a majority of the votes cast favor the issuance of the said bonds in the amount aforesaid for the purposes herein described, then this ordinance shall immediately go into effect, and the governing body of the Town of Murphy shall be fully empowered and authorized to prepare, issue and sell the coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy to an amount not exceeding \$100,000.00 for the purposes as set out in section 1 of this ordinance, and to levy a tax annually thereafter for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of said bonds as they mature.

Section 6. That notice of the aforesaid election shall be given by publication of a copy of this ordinance for three successive weeks in The Cherokee Scout, a weekly newspaper published in Murphy, N. C., the first publication thereof to be not later than twenty days prior to the date of holding of said election.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 14th day of June, 1924, and first published on the 20th day of June, 1924.

Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within 30 days after its first publication.
