

Save Soybean Seed By Planting In Rows

Raleigh March 2. At least half the cost of soybean seed may be saved by planting in rows instead of broadcast. Since these seeds are scarce and this year, farmers in Piedmont and Western Carolina should adopt this practice this year.

advises E.G. Blair, extension agronomist for the State College of Agriculture.

Mr. Blair says, "By planting in rows half the cost of soybean seed may be saved. It takes about one and one-half bushels or ninety pounds of soybeans to drill an acre, but forty pounds will plant the same acre in rows three feet apart. With the beans costing \$3 per bushel, seed to drill an acre will cost \$4.50, while if planted in rows the cost of seed will be only \$2.00.

"Small seeded varieties like Laredo and Virginia will require even seed, about 15 to 30 pounds per acre.

For best results, soybeans should be planted late as after small grain. When planted in rows use the corn planter with a plate that will drop the seed from two to three inches apart. Care should be taken not to cover over an inch in depth or a poor stand will result. Fertilizer should be stirred into the soil thoroughly before planting to avoid burning the young roots. The crop needs to be cultivated two or three times during the year."

Mr. Blair states that this cultivation means more work than if the beans were drilled but the yield of hay will be larger. Then, too, he finds that soybeans planted in rows produce a larger amount of seed. If desired, some of the may be allowed to mature and be saved with the regular soybean harvester or cut and threshed.

SEW UP THE HOLES IN FARM POCKETS

NO FARMER CAN REGULARLY BUY FOOD AND GRAIN AND PROSPER

Atlanta, Ga.—(Special.)—"For fifty years or more the generality of our cotton-growing farmers have been regularly going around with holes in their pockets, so to speak, through which dropped any and all profits that could and should have come from their farm operations." "If the South is to ever reach any reasonable degree of farm prosperity, those holes must be sewed up," said H. B. Hastings, leading agricultural authority and chairman of the Farm and Marketing Bureau of the Atlanta Chamber of Commerce.

"I have been in practically every state in our own country, as well as many foreign countries. I have yet to see any state or section where food and grain buying by farmers was the regular practice that did not show relative poverty on the part of those farmers. On the other hand, I have never been in any state or section where food and grain was grown sufficient at least for home needs where farm prosperity did not show.

"If he would, the Southern farmer could be the richest farmer in the United States instead of the poorest, which he is. The reason he isn't prosperous is because he persists in following a farm system that has proved a failure the world over regardless of the particular crop grown. "The South's dependence on cotton and the regular purchase of food and grain from other sections is the real cause of the Southern farmer's lack of prosperity. And things are not going to get right with our farmers until they quit having their smoke houses in Chicago or Omaha and their corn cribs in Iowa or Kansas.

"The 1923 cotton crop is going to be one of the most expensive to make we have ever seen. Food, grain, labor and fertilizer are all high. Every pound of food or grain needed by farm family or working live stock should be produced on home acres, and that production started in garden and in field just as early as season conditions will permit. Home production of every pound of food, grain and forage needed for home consumption on the farm in 1925 will stop up the holes in the South's farm pocket, and it's the only way to stop them up."

Mr. Armstrong says that the sale of chicks and broilers helped out in the above income but the eggs alone would have made a nice profit. He secured an average yield of 150 eggs during the year.

Mr. Armstrong is manager of a mammoth incubator for the Coastal Plain Fair Association and one of the best cooperators now working with the extension division. He grows White Langhorn poultry.
