## SALE OF MUNICIPAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA.

The Town of Murphy, North Carolina, offers for sale upon sealed bids or proposals two issues of bonds of the said municipality, both by authority of the Municipal Finance Act, as follows:

Forty Thousand Dollars of water bonds, bearing six per cent interest maturing one thousand dollars yearly, beginning three years after date of issuance, for thirty-six years 1928 to 1963, both inclusive, and two thousand dollars in each of the years 1964 and 1965.

Twenty Thousand Dollars of Street Improvement bonds, bearing six per cent interest, two thousand dollars to mature each year, beginning three years after date of issuance, for six years 1928 to 1933, both inclusive, and four thousand dollars in each of the years 1934 and 1935.

Bidders may submit proposal for either of said issues or for both, and each bidder must present with his bid a certified check upon an incorporated bank or trust company, payable to the order of the municipality, or of an executive, financial or clerical officer thereof, or a sum of money for or in the amount equal to two per centum of the face amount of the bonds bid for, to secure the municipality against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid.

The sealed proposal will be opened in public on the 7th day of November, 1925, at the office of the Mayor of Murphy, in the Library Building in said town, and proposals will be received until that time. Further information can be obtained from the undersigned. This October 22nd, 1925.

PROCLAMATION

Whereas, an affidavit having been filed with the undersigned, Justices of the Peace of Cherokee County, North Carolina, giving information that a felony has been committed by Walter Bryson, in that he is charged with willfully, unlawfully and feloniously, and of his malice aforethought having killed and murdered one "Bud" Bryson, and the said Walter Bryson flees from Justice, conceals himself, and evades arrest and service of the issued process of the law.

Wherefore, the undersigned, Justices of the Peace of Cherokee County, issues this their proclamation against the said Walter Bryson, requiring him, the said Walter Bryson, forthwith to surrender himself, and hereby empowers and requires the Sheriff of Cherokee County, North Carolina, to take such power with him as he shall think fit and necessary for the going in search and pursuit of, and effectually apprehending the said Walter Bryson.

And the said Walter Bryson is hereby warned that if he, the said Walter Bryson, continues to stay out, lurk and conceal himself, and does not immediately surrender himself, then any citizen of the County may capture and bring him to Justice, and in case of flight or resistance by him, the said Walter Bryson, after being called upon and warned to surrender, may slay him without accusation or impeachment of any crime.

It is hereby directed that this proclamation shall be published at the door of the court House at Murphy, Cherokee County, and also that it be published once a week for four weeks in the Cherokee Scout, a newspaper published in said County.

## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS, SIX PER CENT, STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina.

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing funds to improve the streets of the Town of Murphy by laying penetration macadam pavement upon Peachtree Street, Tennessee Street, Hiwassee Street, Valley River Avenue, Walnut Street Terrace Avenue and Grant Street in said town there shall be issued and sold negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, to the amount of Twenty thousand Dollars, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semi-annually, and to mature serially in the maximum period of ten years, two thousand dollars of said bonds to mature each year, beginning three years after date of issuance, for six years, 1928 to 1933 both inclusive, and four thousand dollars in each of the years 1934 and 1935, and said bonds shall bear such date and be issued in such form as the governing body of the Town of Murphy may, by resolution, determine.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debt of said municipality has been filed with the clerk of the said municipality and is open for public inspection.

Section 4. That the probable period of usefulness of said improvement for which said bonds are to be issued is ten years.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the provisions of law, and that in such event, it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the municipality at an election as is provided by law.

The foregoing ordinance was

passed on the 12th day of October, 1925, and was first published on the 16th day of October, 1925. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS WATER BONDS OF THE TOWN OF MURPHY, NORTH CAROLINA

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina.

Section 1. That for the purpose of providing funds to install a pumping and filtering plant and extend the watermain to supply water for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, there shall be issued and sold negotiable coupon bonds of the Town of Murphy, North Carolina, to the amount of Forty Thousand Dollars, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of six per cent, payable semi-annually, and to mature serially in the maximum period of forty years, one thousand dollars of said bonds to mature each year, beginning three years after date of issuance, for thirty-six years 1928 to 1963, both inclusive, and two thousand dollars in each of the years 1964 and 1965, and said bonds shall bear such date and be issued in such form as the governing body of the Town of Murphy may, by resolution, determine.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debts of said municipality has been filed with the Clerk of the said municipality and is open for public inspection.
