




THE peril of the road crossing has become a national problem with the multiplication of automobiles.

The Southern Railway System has eliminated 800 grade crossings, and is eliminating more every year, but over 6,000 remain to be separated on this system alone. The total cost to complete the work is a stupendous sumprobably half es much as the cost to build the railroads.

Even if the money were available, and the public willing to pay the increased freight and passenger rates neces-sary to provide a fair return on it, many years would be required to do the work.
