More Than Meets the Nation's Billion Dollar Highway Building Bill—Thomas H. MacDonald, Chief of the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads, Tells Striking Details.

America has reverted to the ancient system of collecting tolls wherewith to build and maintain highways. In 1925 these tolls amounted to \$1,094,000,000, collected through motor licenses, gasoline taxes, property, corporation, income production and other taxes on automobiles, automobile manufactures, the petroleum industry, etc. In the same year \$1,003,000,000 was spent on rural roads. It took near a century to build \$20,000,000,000 worth of rail-roads. A highway system costing that much will be created in twenty years at present rate.
