Culberson Schools Individual Drinking Cup Problem Solved
When I came here two years ago one among the many great school problems I had to face was that of a sanitary method of supplying drinking water to the individuals. After a consultation with the teachers we decided to introduce and encourage the use of individual drinking cups. The pupil and patrons were asked to co-operate in putting this plan across.

The response to the request was fairly good but at the best this plan was a very annoying thing. In spite of all that could be done by both the teachers and parents it proved to be ineffective. Some of the pupils would forget or lose his cup, many thru mistake would get their cups mixed, many would trade cups, while many would borrow cups from desk-mate, etc. etc. Well, it might be said that sanitary drinking was a complete failure.

When I came back this year I hadn't yet forgotten the drinking problem of last year. So I began to think and to think fast.

I was aware of the hearty response of the parents in putting across all that I had undertaken for the good of the school the year before. I thought, well they came to my assistance last year and I believe that they will again. Anyway we will not give up without a trial.

I called the committee together with the other teachers to meet for discussion of the current needs of the school the day of school. We met

and an interesting discussion ensued which many problems were discussed. But that wasn't getting us anywhere. There had to be action. So I introduced the question of solving the drinking problem and suggested that we have a box supper the following Saturday night to raise money to purchase a sanitary drinking fountain which would only cost about \$20.00. The suggestion was accepted and we began work, advertising, etc. for box supper. When Saturday night came, the house was filled with people and we made the sum of \$42.75 out of the boxes. I then ordered the fountain which cost something over \$22 and thus had a nice one left to buy additional cups for the library. Now we have the sanitary drinking problem solved. The pupils are delighted with the idea of having a drinking fountain and of getting rid of troublesome individual drinking cups which was so hard to keep up with. I would suggest that other teachers who are annoyed with individual cup problems try this plan as I believe that in most instances if the teachers will become interested in the welfare of the community in which they teach and show to the parents and pupils that we are interested by taking an active part in both Sunday School and Church as well as every unit of work that makes for the upbuilding of the community that we will receive hearty co-operation in return. In fact, I believe that they expect it of us and of a right ought so for it is their hard earned money that goes to pay our salary at the close of each month.
