Sheriff N. W. Abernathy and Deputy O. C. Davis went to Atlanta Thursday afternoon and brought Herman Logan back to Murphy to answer charges of store breaking, in connection with the robbery of Wofford-Terrell Company a week or so ago.

Logan was apprehended by the Atlanta police upon advice of local officers, but refused to return to answer the charges. Papers for his extradition were secured from Governor McLean and signed by Governor Hardman, of Georgia. The papers arrived at Murphy Thursday afternoon on the 2 o'clock train, and Sheriff Abernathy and his deputy made the trip by automobile, arriving in Murphy with Logan about midnight Thursday.

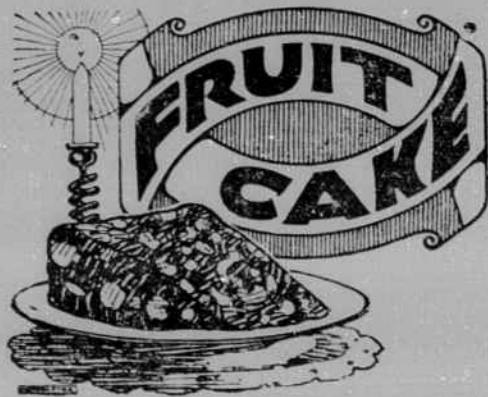

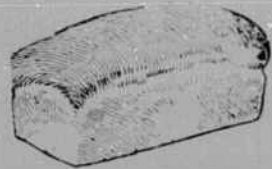

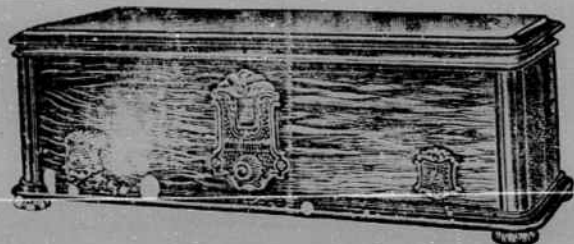
