NORTH CAROLINA—CHEROKEE COUNTY, IN RE—PUBLIC COUNTY HOSPITAL.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Cherokee County held at the court house in Murphy, N. C. the 4th day of March, 1929, it being the first Monday in said month, the following proceedings are had:

The following petition signed by more than two hundred freeholders of Cherokee County having heretofore been presented to the Board, to-wit:

"To the Commissioners of Cherokee County, Murphy, North Carolina:

The undersigned citizens, tax payers and resident freeholders of Cherokee County, would respectfully request your Honorable Board to levy an annual tax for the establishment and maintenance of a public hospital at a place in said county to be hereafter selected by your Honorable Board and the amount of money proposed to be expended the maximum amount is hereby requested to be the sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars; it being understood by the undersigned that Duke Foundation will donate or give to said County for said purpose, an additional sum of Thirty-five Thousand Dollars, which said board, the question of establishment of said public hospital shall be submitted to the will of said County for the sum of Seventy Thousand Dollars.

It is further understood by the undersigned that upon the filing of this petition with the qualified electors, and that should said election carry, the tax to be levied under such election shall not exceed one-fifth of one percent on the dollar, for the erection of said hospital. The undersigned understand that Duke Foundation will, upon erection of said hospital contribute to the maintenance of said hospital the sum of one dollar a day for each charity or free bed maintained in said hospital.

Which said petition is signed by more than two hundred persons, who are found as a list by this Board to be freeholders of Cherokee County.

And at the meeting of the Board of Commissioners held on the first Monday in December, 1928, an election was called to be held on the 19th day of March, 1929, to ascertain the will of the electors of Cherokee County upon the said petition and the proposal to erect a public hospital.

And whereas, at the meeting of this Board held on the first Monday in February, 1929, an order was entered postponing the said election until the 28th day of May, 1929, and it is now deemed proper to set another date for the said election so that any doubt which may exist as to the sufficiency of the advertisement of said election may be removed, and the electors of the county have an opportunity to express themselves at the polls in reference to the said petition and the proposal to levy a special tax.

It is now ordered by the said Board of Com-

missioners that a special election be held at every voting place in Cherokee County on Tuesday, the 11th day of June, 1929, at which election the question of whether or not the County of Cherokee through and by its governing body shall levy upon the assessed property of Cherokee County a tax not exceeding one-fiftieth of one cent on the dollar for the purchase of real estate, for hospital purposes, for the construction of hospital buildings and for maintaining the same, or for either or all of said purposes, for a period of not exceeding thirty years. The amount to be contributed by Cherokee County towards the purchase or establishment of said hospital is not to exceed thirty-five thousand dollars. To the end that said election may be held as provided by law, it is ordered that a new registration of the voters of Cherokee County be had at each voting precinct in Cherokee County. The registration books for the purpose of registering those who may desire to vote in said election shall be opened on the fifth Saturday preceding the day of election and close for registration on the second Saturday preceding the election. And the said registration and election shall be held pursuant to the laws governing the election of officers for such county of Cherokee.

The ballot to be used at said election shall be as follows:

[] Yes. For a levy of one-fiftieth of one cent on the dollar tax for a bond issue for a public hospital and maintenance of same.

[] No.

It is ordered that this order be published in the Cherokee Scout, a weekly newspaper published in Murphy, N. C. for a period of ninety days preceding the day on which said election is to be held and that a copy of the same be posted in each township of Cherokee County.
