

Built to Fly in the Stratosphere



This is the F-1000-1, France's first stratosphere built by Henry Farman with support of the government, which was given its first test near Versailles recently in the presence of many aviation experts. The plane is designed to attain a speed up to 375 miles an hour flying at altitudes above 60,000 feet. It is chiefly distinguished from an ordinary monoplane by its great wingspread and by the air compressors attached to the fuselage enabling flyers and motor to breathe compressed stratosphere air. It is hoped that a trip from Paris to New York may be made in less than 10 hours in the new plane.

Brown and White Rice

Brown rice is unpolished rice. The husk has been removed, but most of the bran and germ have been retained. For this reason unpolished or "brown" rice has a rich vitamin B and mineral content.

White rice, which is always polished rice, has lost both the germ and the bran layer and the grain is made lighter in color. Polished rice, according to one authority on foods, "is poorer in protein, mineral elements and fat than any other of the cereal grains."

Fractional Voting

It sometimes happens that a political party desires to honor more of its members by appointment as delegates to the national conventions than the quota allotted to a state covers. In such cases it is frequently arranged that two and sometimes more individuals are sent as delegates, each having a half or other part vote as the case may be. Where uninstructed delegates are sent, these fractions of votes are added in the final tabulation of the votes.
