This is the F-1000-1, France's first stratoplane built by Henry Farman with support of the government, was given its first test near Versailles recently in the presence of many aviation experts. White rice, which is aiways polyshed rice, has lost both the germ and the bran layer and the grain is made liguter in color. Polished rice, according to one authority on foods, "is poorer in protein, mineral elements and fat than any other of the cereal grains."
