

CIVIC PROJECTS ARE DISCUSSED BY LIONS CLUB

Sale of Easter Seals Started; "Clean Up" Week To Be Sponsored

Discussion of a number of civic projects featured the meeting of the Murphy Lions Club held in the Methodist church Tuesday night.

H. Bueck, a member of the Cherokee county committee in charge of the sale of Easter seals to aid indigent crippled children, distributed part of the 10,000 seals allotted him among members in an effort to dispose of them.

Dr. Ed Adams, secretary of the club described the purpose of the seals. He declared that state and endowed clinics had helped a number of local crippled children and that the proceeds from the Easter Stamps, which sell at a penny each would be used to maintain the clinics.

A plea was heard from the county agent's office to have the club join in sponsoring a local "clean-up" movement during the national "Clean Up" week from April 24 to 28.

Guy Wheeler and I. B. Jester, members of the Clay county agent's office, and Ralph Smith, member of the Haynesville faculty, all of Haynesville accompanied Lion James Penard to the meeting to discuss organization of a Lions club in Clay county. Each made a short talk.

J. T. Moore, TVA employee, was introduced as the club's newest member.

It was voted to hold the semi-monthly meetings at 6:30 rather than 6 o'clock during the summer months.

Committees appointed to seek information of the highway from Murphy down the north side of the river to the Hiwassee dam, seek a system of traffic blinker lights on the public square here, and seek maintenance of a CCC camp at Robbinsville were heard at the meeting.

Timely Farm Questions

QUESTION: What is the best fertilizer for early sweet potatoes.

ANSWER: Where the early crop is grown on sandy soils a mixture of three percent nitrogen, eight percent phosphoric acid, and eight percent potash, applied at the rate of 1,000 to 1,200 pounds an acre is recommended.

If more than this is used, one-half should be applied before planting and the remaining fertilizer put on as a side application soon after the plants are well rooted. Lime is not recommended for sweet potato soils nor should stable manure be used in the ridge.

QUESTION: Why is it that my broilers do not feather out properly?

ANSWER: Early feathering is an inherited characteristic and, while diet and humidity are related to feathering, if this factor is not established in the breeders it is difficult to bring it out by careful management. If the trouble is consistent in a number of lots of chicks, it would be best to discard the breeding stock. In selecting new breeding stock, be sure that the parent flock has this characteristic as well as size and shape so necessary in broiler production.

QUESTION: How can I control blight on my apple trees?

ANSWER: Recent experiments have shown that one pound of copper sulphate, also known as bluestone, and two pounds of chemical grade hydrated lime in fifty gallons of water, applied when the trees are in full bloom, will give definite benefits of control. The spraying must be done when the flowers are in bloom. It is sometimes difficult to get full control due to ir-

TWO CUT, ONE IS JAILED IN MELEE AFTER ACCIDENT

As the aftermath of an automobile collision at Bell Hill, near Isabella, Sunday afternoon, Jim Olvey a CCC enrollee stationed near Blairsville, Ga., is in the Murphy jail held without bond, Sam Caylor was sent to the hospital at Ducktown suffering from serious knife wounds, and Otis Caylor, Sam's brother, is nursing minor knife wounds allegedly inflicted by Jim Olvey.

After the accident, in which no one was hurt, the Caylor boys, with four companions, Bill Cearley, and three of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Simond's daughters left the car in which they were riding and walked on across the Angelica Gap and when near Elbert Simonds' Jim Olvey and Arthur Carter, who had pulled their car out of the wreck, turned it around, overtook them and stopped and began to curse and abuse them, according to testimony given before Esq. W. L. Garren, before whom Olvey was arraigned, after Caylor was brought back from the hospital.

All the parties that were involved in the trouble were residents of Georgia, except Arthur Carter, who lives near Isabella. He made his escape back into Tennessee, but Olvey was run down by former deputy sheriff Elbert Simonds who appeared on the scene just before the wind up of the melee. Mr. Simonds, who was commended for his action in the matter, immediately turned Olvey over to deputy sheriff C. D. Clore.

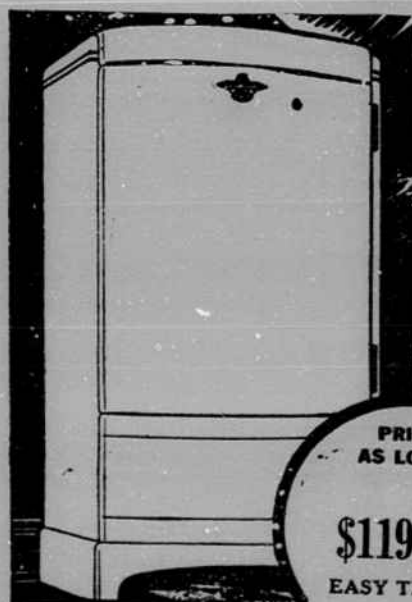
