"Dawn in Lyonesse" by Mary Ellen Chase. This appealing and beautiful novel of two servant women is compressed into the compass of forty-eight hours and holds not only tragedy and pathos, but dignity and true greatness of spirit. Its setting is the background of the old romance of Tristan and Iseult. "The Mortal Storm" by Phyllis Bottome. This is a story of family life in Germany under the Nazi Regime. All the characters are living people, not types. Particularly memorable is Freya, the courageous and intelligent girl, who when the storm breaks, has to learn through bitter choice what dreams to jettison and what course to steer. "American Years" by Harold Sinclair. The panorama of American growth, through the story of a frontier town and its founders. "Johnny Johnson, A play in three acts by Paul Green. "A hilarious medley of satire, musical comedy,
