Mrs. Thelma Richards, 25, of Sylva, was burned to death Saturday morning at 5 o'clock when her home in Sylva located in back of the hospital was in flames when the fire was discovered.

Her husband, Carl Richards, engaged in a Sylva cafe, left the house at 4 o'clock a. m. to begin his duties for the day.

Mrs. Richards apparently had discovered her home was on fire for she made an attempt to escape. She was overcome by the flames and smoke.

Her husband ran into the building three times, it is said, in an effort to rescue his wife and on the third trip succeeded in finding her body and brought her out. She was alive when she was rescued from the burning building but was reported dead when the body was taken to the hospital here.

Mrs. Richards was employed at the Almond grills.

She is survived by her husband; her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Baxter Higdon, of Almond, and by several brothers and sisters.

The body will be taken to Almond Sunday for funeral services Monday.

Mrs. Richards formerly lived in Andrews and was widely-known and related here. She is a member of the prominent Higdon family.
