Mrs. Sarah Odell visited Mr. and Mrs. Howard Odell one day last week.

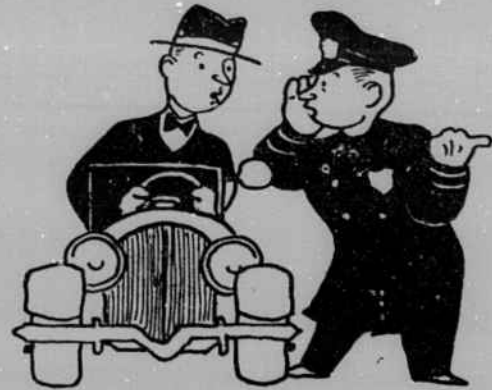

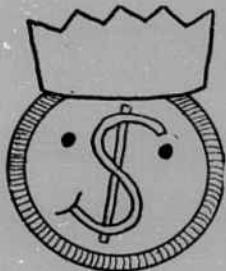
