QUESTION: Will a hen that quits laying and molts during the Spring and summer come back into produtcion early next fall when egg prices go up?

ANSWER: Late molters are quick molters. Records show that the best layers are late molers and that the early molters take a long time to complete the job and lay at a slower rate when they do start back. When feed and water are kept before a flock, the birds that molt before September are usually not worth carrying over another year, should
