bill dove up, hauled Mr. Patton from his car, and told him he was under arrest for illegal parking. Patton says they offered to release him for \$25, then cut the price to \$10, and finally to \$4, which he agreed to pay.

"Then I decided they were not officers," he testified. "and I told them I wouldn't pay them anything. With that they hauled me back in their car, and took 45 cents, and my pliers and knife. Then they dragged me out of the car and began beating me. My wife tried to stop them and she got struck on the head. She began screaming, and they fled."

Both the convicted men denied having anything to do with the hold up. Attorney Mallonee, who represented them, pleaded with the Judge, stating that he did not believe the two were guilty.

Judge Bobbit replied that he differed. He added that while he "might be wrong" he believed that the two Picklesimer boys he had ordered released because of lack of positive identification were also guilty.

Attorney Mallonee then made an extended plea for mercy. He said W. F. Picklesimer, who came here to visit his aged father, had a good job in Virginia, had money in bank, had a good reputation, and was willing to sell his automobile, if necessary, to pay a fine that would keep him out of the penitentiary. His pleas were in vain.

A moment after Olmsted had turned over his money to the alleged attorney all three men leaped in a car and fled. Cobb went to Atlanta and then to Cincinnati, where he was arrested and put up a vain fight against extradition. The other two men have not yet been captured. They are reported to have fled to Cuba.

Cobb claimed that Olmsted lost the money playing poker. Cobb said he did not play, but testifying at the extradition proceedings he admitted he had received \$500 of the money. He could not explain why.

Evidence by Frank Forsyth of the Citizens Bank and Trust Co., by Chief of Police Fred Johnson, and other disinterested witnesses showed that Olmsted had drawn the money from the bank at five minutes after twelve and at 12:15—only ten minutes later, was at the home of Chief Johnson asking his aid. In those ten minutes Olmsted had driven to East Murphy. Cobb and his two companions had fled with the money. Olmsted had gotten Clerk of the Court, Hugh Leatherwood, of Waynesville to give him a lift to Murphy, where the town was circled in a vain search for the car of the confidence men: had picked up his wife and told her of the robbery, had phoned Chief Johnson and made an appointment, and then had driven to Johnson's home nearly a mile distant.

It was pointed out that under this time schedule Olmsted would have had to lose \$2,000 at poker in not more than two minutes.

The Jurors, which included three ministers, refused to believe such a story. They were out only about 30 minutes.

rested on an illegal possession charge, and was given a suspended sentence of eight months, to extend over a probation period of two years.

Tilson did not remember the exact date, but figured that when he convened this term, his probation was ended. So he decided to celebrate. With two friends he purchased a gallon of bootleg corn liquor. The party came to Murphy, with Tilson carrying what was left of the jar of "apple," and shortly thereafter he was in jail.

When his case was called Friday, investigation showed that his probation had two more days to run.

Tilson pleaded that he thought his time was up, that he had just gone to work for the TVA, and that he had a wife and child dependent on him, but Judge Bobbit pointed out that he was powerless to set aside the eight months suspended sentence.
