Who will be the candidate for the office of Clerk of the Superior Court, in the event that John Donley refuses to seek reelection, is problematical in both parties. No one seems to want the post, the general attitude being that since passage of the law stepping the fees, and putting the post on a straight salary basis the pay is too small to make a rare worth while. One man, approached by his friends to make the race declared he wouldn't rave the office as a gift. "He explained:

devote its efforts to bringing both tourists an dindustry to Cherokee, leaving it up to the newcomers to choose their own localities. It has been pointed out that a visitor invariably visits all the places in the county, and decides for himself, in any event.

Tourist trade, for the duration of

the war, will be especially valuable, it is pointed out, because tire shortage makes it probable that visitors will stay weeks instead of days.

It is admitted that there is little likelihood of getting a private industry here while the war is on, but the County-wide chamber would build for the future. Meanwhile long-time visitors must necessarily increase the general prosperity of the residents. Those in rural sections, for instance, will find a more ready home market for their produce.

According to Jeff Hays, of Tomotla, a County-wide Chamber will attract "at least 1,000 members" from the County at large.
