A representative from the Navy Recruiting Station in Asheville, spent Monday and Tuesday in Murphy at the county court house recruiting for the Navy. Chief Baskerville stated that he had a very successful trip and accepted many fine Cherokee boys for the Navy. The citizens here expressed more interest about the Navy trade schools than ever, and from all indications the youth who will come under the new draft, or the 18 and 19-year-old boys intend to volunteer before they are drafted for other branches of the service.

The Navy offers rapid promotions, good pay (starting at \$50. The second month you are advanced to Seaman second class and are increased in pay to \$54). \$133 worth of uniforms are given free, travel, adventure, free board and lodging, medical and dental care. Every man in the Navy is taught some skilled trade that will help in civilian life after this war. The youth of Murphy and Cherokee county are urged to investigate the Navy program before it is too late and he cannot make his choice.
