Dr. Paisley is a native of Arkan-sas, where he received his elementary and college training, receiv ing the A. B. degree from Arkanus college, which is the Presbyterian Synodical college. Later, his Alma Mater conferred upon him the honory degree of Doctor of Divinity. His theological training was received at Columbia semin ary, then located at Columbia, S C. but is now at Decatur.
