### Council Says Audit Report Charges Are Too High

Murphy on Friday night were presented the audit report for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943, from W. Bowen Henderson, auditor, of Asheville. The books had been in the hands of the auditor for an audit since May, 1943. At the January meeting of the council. return of the town books taken to Asheville was requested.

The Town was presented a bill for \$1058.58 for the auditing, and considerable discussion between the councilmen and representa-Ma- tives of the auditing firm took mate, second class, place.
