

### Concrete Pouring Record Broken Monday at Fontana

TVA's construction crews at Fontana Dam, North Carolina, broke the Authority's concrete pouring record Monday of last week by placing 10,693 cubic yards in 24 hours in the fast-growing giant which will be capable of producing enough electricity each day to make the aluminum needed to build 16 big bombers.

"If the present rate of pouring continues," F. C. Schlemmer, Project Manager, said, "Fontana will have grown by more than 200,000 cubic yards during April, a record monthly pour." TVA has several times broken its own pouring records at Fontana, the previous high marks being 9390 cubic yards April 15, 1944, and 9213 cubic yards August 23, 1943. High-

est monthly record is 194,192 cubic yards in March. "Ten thousand yards is the goal that every man and woman at Fontana has been aiming at and it is a proud day for us to have reached it," Mr. Schlemmer said. "The fact that we reached it yesterday—in spite of a number of handicaps, such as labor shortage—is representative of the kind of cooperative organization Fontana is. It took the interest, energetic effort, cooperation and hard work of every individual on the job. We'll beat this record, though, and the next one and the next one, until the job is finished."

### OPA Regulations

**DAIRY FEED** — MPR 526, effective April 15, establishes ceilings for brewer's dried grains and dried malt sprouts of all grades at levels approximately \$2.25 per ton above the weighted average maximum price for dried grains under GMPR.

**ELECTRIC LIGHT BULBS** — The amount of the new Federal excise tax which retailers of electric light bulbs may pass on to consumers is based on the amount of the tax passed on to them by manufacturers or wholesalers. OPA announced.

**WOMEN'S RAYON HOSIERY** — Second RMPR 339, Am. 1, effective as of April 13 — Permits chain stores which purchased more than 50 per cent of their full-fashioned hosiery from wholesalers in each of the years 1941, 1942 and 1943 to sell the hosiery bought from wholesalers, on special OPA authorization, at the ceilings established for independent retailers purchasing from wholesalers, and makes certain other changes to make provisions conform to industry conditions and practices.

**CORN MEAL, HOMINY PRODUCTS** — MPR 421, Am. 9; MPR 422, Am. 14, MPR 423, Am. 15, all effective May 1 makes slight reductions in wholesale and retail percentage mark-ups for corn meal and hominy products.

both effective April 19 — Establish specific ceilings for all sales of used gas cooking ranges, and removes sales of all kinds of used household cooking and space heating stoves not subject to the new specific ceilings from coverage by GMPR.

**COTTON RUGS** — RMPR 504. Permits rug material dealers selling directly to collectors or rug makers to change 3c per pound over the maximum prices which they may pay mills or wholesale waste dealers for the raw materials, and makes certain other changes in the order.

**POTATOES, ONIONS** — RMPR 271, Am. 13, effective as of April 14 — Requires wholesalers to base their weekly determination of ceilings for potatoes and onions on separate "largest single purchased of potatoes and onions of the 1943 and 1944 crops.

**COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLES** — GMPR, Rev. Sugg. Reg. 14, Am. 115, effective April 19 — Specifies that commercial motor vehicles which have not been used except for the purpose of sale may be resold by the original purchaser at the price paid, including increment charges paid by him.
