Open seasons on trout run through August 31, rock bass and small mouthed bass through Aug ust 31, except that Little River be ow Sinks Bridge and Abrams Creek below Abrams Falls are clos ed to all fishing until June 16 Night fishing is prohibited and there is no open season on other species of fish. Fishing is permit ted only with artificial lures, limited to one hook; but two or more artificial flies may be attached to the leader. State or county fishing

Misunderstanding Of Medical Care For Veterans

Declaring that there is consider able misunderstanding concerning medical care for exservicemen and women, Dr. A. J. Weirick of the Veterans Administration points out that out-patient treatment and hospitalization are subject to restrictions imposed by law.

Dr. Weirick, who is chief medical officer of the VA's regional office here, said that many persons hav: the mistaken idea that any veterar may receive medical treatment and hospitalization and then send the bills to the Veterans Administra-

declared, "but it is sufficiently simple that a veteran who required medical care for a service-connect ed disability or ailment may re ceive it promptly.

Dr. Weirick said that the recent ly announced contracts with the North Carolina did not change the basic regulations concerning medi cal care. These contracts, he explained, merely make it possible for the VA to provide better service to veterans with service-connected disabilities. They make no change in procedure relative to disabilities that are not service-con

"The law is that all veterans with service-connected disabilities -that is, with disabilities that arose out of their service to the country or that were aggravated in be furnished complete medical care for such disabilities" the medical officer stated . "The law

that disability. Veterans who have no service-connected disabilities decorate the rooms. may be hospitalized in VA hospitals or other federal hospitals under certain conditions.

Out-patient treatment may be provided for service-connected disabilities at a VA clinic or by private physicians in the veteran's home community at government expense, Dr. Weirick went on. Outpatient treatment is not available for any disability that is not service-connected except in the case of veterans with service-connected exservice-connected disabilities who are taking vocational rehabilitation training under Public Law 16 These veterans may receive outpatient care for any disability or ailment while they are in training


