### Announces Open Fishing Season In The Smokies

Blair Ross, superintendent of the Smoky Mountain National Park, has announced open and closed season in the national park of 1946. Main streams only are open to fishing; all tributaries are closed. To put it simply, this means that in North Carolina, open waters are Big Creek below Gunter Fork, Swallow Fork, and McGinty Creek, Cataloochee Creek below Palmer Creek; Rough Fork below end of truck trail; Caldwell Fork below McKee Branch; Oconaluftee River below Wild Cherry Branch; Bradley Fork below Chasteen Creek; Straight Fork below Ledge Creek; Raven Fork below Cherokee Reservation; Deep Creek below the Forks; Left Fork below Hermit Branch; Indian Creek below George's Branch; Forney Creek below Jonas Creek; Bear Creek below Poplar Flats; Twenty-mile Creek below Forks; Right Fork below end of truck trail; Left Fork below end of truck trail.

Open seasons on trout run through August 31, rock bass and small mouthed bass through August 31, except that Little River below Sinks Bridge and Abrams Creek below Abrams Falls are closed to all fishing until June 15. Night fishing is prohibited and there is no open season on other species of fish. Fishing is permitted only with artificial lures, limited to one hook; but two or more artificial flies may be attached to the leader. State or county fishing licenses are required.

### Says There Is Misunderstanding Of Medical Care For Veterans

Declaring that there is considerable misunderstanding concerning medical care for exservicemen and women, Dr. A. J. Weirick of the Veterans Administration points out that out-patient treatment and hospitalization are subject to restrictions imposed by law.

Dr. Weirick, who is chief medical officer of the VA's regional office here, said that many persons have the mistaken idea that any veteran may receive medical treatment and hospitalization and then send the bills to the Veterans Administration for payment.

"It's not as simple as that", he declared, "but it is sufficiently simple that a veteran who required medical care for a service-connected disability or ailment may receive it promptly."

Dr. Weirick said that the recently announced contracts with the Hospital Saving Association of North Carolina did not change the basic regulations concerning medical care. These contracts, he explained, merely make it possible for the VA to provide better service to veterans with service-connected disabilities. They make no change in procedure relative to disabilities that are not service-connected.

"The law is that all veterans with service-connected disabilities—that is, with disabilities that arose out of their service to the country or that were aggravated in the service of their country—shall be furnished complete medical care for such disabilities", the medical officer stated. "The law

provides that a veteran with a service-connected disability is entitled to hospitalization or out-patient care for that disability. Veterans who have no service-connected disabilities may be hospitalized in VA hospitals or other federal hospitals under certain conditions."

Out-patient treatment may be provided for service-connected disabilities at a VA clinic or by private physicians in the veteran's home community at government expense, Dr. Weirick went on. Out-patient treatment is not available for any disability that is not service-connected except in the case of veterans with service-connected disabilities who are taking vocational rehabilitation training under Public Law 12. These veterans may receive out-patient care for any disability or ailment while they are in training.
