Butler Speaks On Nantahala Power Expansion

ANDREWS — Gordon Lee Butler, Sr., general superintendent of the Nantahala Power plant on the Nantahala River at Beechertown, was speaker at the Andrews Rotary club Thursday of last week. This was Mr. Butler's maiden speech as a Rotarian. He talked on contemplated developments that the Nantahala Power & Light Company plan in this region. The first on the list is that at Queen's Creek. This will be a small plant, comparatively speaking, develop-

ing 2,000 horsepower as compared with the Nantahala plant which develops 60,000 horsepower. Mr. Butler stated that the power company eventually expects to make developments at Dick's Creek and White Oak Creek. He then gave a technical and general description of the Nantahala plant.
