To Construct Four New Rooms Andrews School

ANDREWS — The Andrews School board, with a lot of faith and not much money, has under way plans for constructing four additional rooms to the Brick Elementary school building here to relieve a seriously crowded condition. The school board is going ahead on the program with the amount of money it has on hand in its local funds without any call on the county for help at this time. However, the Andrews School board has advised the county board of commissioners that at such time as its board may have money for distribution in a capital outlay program that it would expect reimbursement from the county to the extent of local funds spent in the present project.

Work on the project will begin within the next ten days. W. T. Moore, well known builder, will be in charge of the work. Board member H. M. Whitaker is acting as purchasing agent. It is hoped to have the work completed by the time school opens, August 14.

As a starter for funds the 1947 graduating class here on Friday night made a cash gift of \$111 to Board Chairman L. B. Nichols for the work when the first public announcement was made on the matter, although the project has been under consideration for several months. The class gift presentation was made by Mary Abernathy.
