National 4-H Club Camp is an annual event which is held each summer. The camp was established in 1927 and was held each summer thereafter until it became necessary to cancel the 1942 meeting on account of the war. It was resumed in the summer of 1946.

Beginning in 1928, and continuing each year, the Atlantic Coast Line has offered these trips as awards to outstanding members selected by the several State 4-H Club leaders.
