Miss Ada Mae Pruetts third grade section won the prize for having the most parents in attendance.

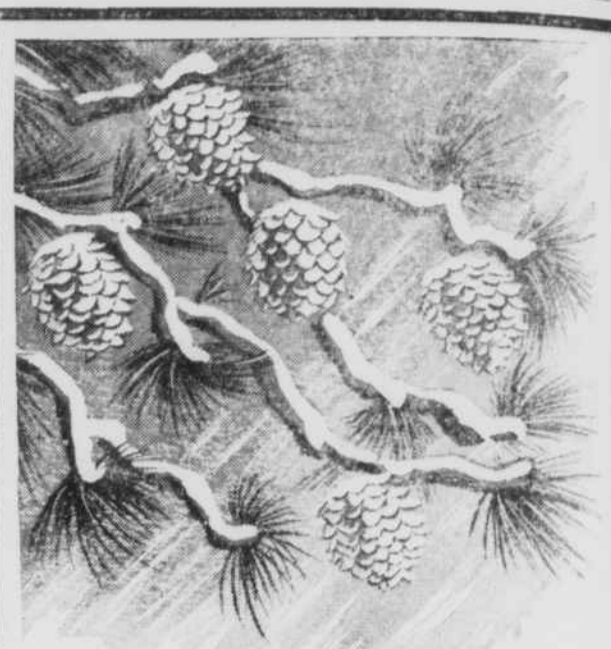
### Mrs. W. H. Grady Resigns Position
