State, Davis said, is a part of approximately 10,500,000 pounds of dried fruits being distributed in nine southeastern states. The fruits were acquired by the U. S. Department of Agriculture through price supporting operations in the West.

The allocation to North Carolina totalling 1,733,970 pounds—24 1/2 carloads — includes 394,250 pounds of dried peaches, 67,500 pounds of dried apples, 637,740 pounds of dried prunes, and 634,500 pounds of raisins.

Other USDA food contributions to the State in recent months have included green beans, sweet potatoes, dried eggs, and Irish potatoes.
