ANDREWS—Funeral services for Pvt. Jack Hogan, U. S. Army, son of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Hogan of Andrews, were held at 2:00 P. M. Tuesday, April 27, at the Chapel in the Valleytown Cemetery. The Rev. Ed Willis of Sylva officiated.

Pvt. Hogan was killed near Fort Lawn, S. C., in a collision when the truck in which he was riding collided with a car carrying four women. The driver of the truck was reported to be James B. Padgett of Charlotte. He was also badly injured. It was not known who was driving the car in which the young women were

riding. Surviving Pvt. Hogan are the parents, two brothers, Wayne Hogan and Floyd Hogan of Gastonia, five sisters, Mrs. Hazel Towery, Gastonia, Mrs. Paul Anderson, Mrs. Jake Brown, Evelyn and Gladys, all of Andrews.

Funeral rites were conducted by the Rev. Algie West and Rev. Clarence Adams.

Interment was in the Andrews cemetery.

## Clinic To Be Held At Andrews School May 7

ANDREWS—The Annual Pre-School Clinic will be conducted at the Andrews elementary school on Friday, May 7. The clinic will continue throughout the school day.

This date is of the utmost importance to parents who have children to be enrolled in the first grade next fall. The parents are asked to accompany their children, in order that remedial defects found may have necessary attention. The child may be brought to the clinic any time during the school day and upon completion of examination the child may return home, as it will not be necessary to stay all day. The children who ride the buses and must remain at school all day will be given lunch in the school lunch room. There will be no charges for these lunches. These children will be under the supervision of the first grade teachers and the Health Nurse throughout the day.

"Every child begins a new and strange experience with the beginning of his formal education, and it is highly desirable that his health be normal in order to throw no obstacle in the path of his adaptability to his new world. Precious time in the child's adjustment period is saved through these pre-school clinics, which discover faulty vision, hearing, and other physical defects that are often easily corrected," says Boyd Robinson, principal of the elementary school.

"The Health Department is acting in the best interest of the children in this work, and should have the complete cooperation of all parents concerned."

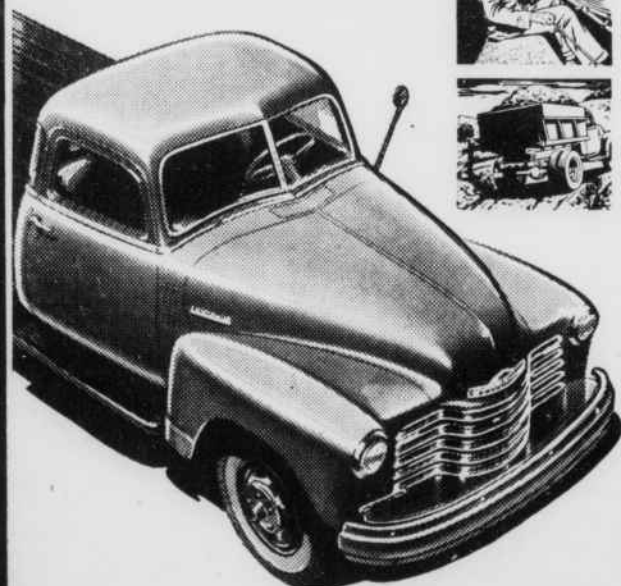
