Women's Clubs Sponsoring Crusade For Children

RALEIGH — Describing the movement as virtually a "World Community Chest," Robert N. Simms, Jr., well-known Raleigh attorney and State legislator, has accepted the State chairmanship of the Crusade for Children campaign, which is being sponsored in this State by the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs.

Mrs. Charles G. Doak, Executive Secretary of the Federation, in announcing that Mr. Simms had agreed to accept the chairmanship, said that Governor R. Gregg Cherry is serving as Honorary State Chairman, with Mrs. James A. Gupton, president of the Federation, occupying the position of co-chairman. Mrs. Doak already has begun her duties as State Campaign Director. She has the cooperation at State headquarters of Mrs. True B. Curley, representing New York headquarters of American Overseas Aid-United Nations Appeal for Children, who has supervision of the Crusade for Children in both North and South Carolina.

The national goal for the Crusade for Children has been set at \$60,000,000, and Mrs. Doak said Mrs. Gupton and officers and members of the Federation's 326 clubs in the State are anticipating with confidence the outcome of unified local appeals, which will begin in the more than three hundred North Carolina communities on Mother's Day, May 9, and continue until this State's proportionate quota of the Crusade's goal has been attained.

In accepting the State chairmanship, Mr. Simms, who served with the United States Marine Corps during the recent World War, wrote as follows to Mrs. Gupton: "I am glad to participate in this United Nations Appeal for Children because it certainly should play a big part in relieving the sufferings of children and mothers who are still in the majority in many nations of the world, and
