

## Adequate Wiring Organization Is Formed Here

A Valley-wide organization has been formed to improve Tennessee Valley homes through better electrical wiring. W. W. Jacobs, manager of the Cleveland, Tennessee, Electric System, announced this week. Mr. Jacobs is chairman of the organization, which is known as the executive committee of the Tennessee Valley Adequate Wiring Bureau.

Members of the committee represent all branches of the electric industry.

The adequate wiring bureau will provide design and inspection service free of charge to home builders here through the City of Murphy Electric Dept., E. G. Hughes, clerk, said.

The organization has been licensed by the National Adequate Wiring Bureau to certify that homes are adequately wired to meet the demands placed on it by the widespread use of electricity in the Tennessee Valley area.

"Many of our homes were wired to provide for lighting and one or two smaller appliances," Mr. Jacobs said in outlining the needs for

better wiring. "These same homes now have added many major appliances, and are adding more all the time," he continued. "The wires in a home are the highways of electrical energy, and today we find ourselves with 1912 highways and 1948 traffic."

Mr. Jacobs pointed out that inadequate wiring was both dangerous and inefficient. "The best solution is to install adequate wiring when the house is built." An educational campaign to inform contractors and other members of the building trade is now under way.

"The average home in this area used about 600 kilowatt-hours of electricity a year back in 1933," Mr. Jacobs declared. "Today, the average for the entire Tennessee Valley is more than 2,400 kilowatt-hours, and the increase is continuing," he said. "The average home in Murphy uses 3812 kilowatt-hours annually." Wiring has not kept pace with this progress in electrical living, and it must be improved to meet the demands of the intelligent home buyer or builder."

## Busy Years Ahead For N. C. Schools

There are busy years ahead for North Carolina's little red school house, says Dr. Selz C. Mayo, associate professor of rural sociology at the North Carolina Agricultural Experiment Station.

Dr. Mayo recently computed estimates of the number of new first graders that white and non-white schools might expect during the next six years. He concludes that in 1954 first grader enrollment in white schools will be half again as large as it was in 1946. In non-white schools there will be a third more new first graders in 1954 than in 1946.

The sociologist bases his estimates on the birthrates from 1939 through 1947, correcting each for infant deaths. He assumes that babies born in a given year will be ready for school about seven years later.

Using 1946 enrollment as 100 per cent, Dr. Mayo says the percentage of white first graders should be 107.6 in 1948, 117.4 in 1949, 125.4 in 1950, 118.5 in 1951, 113.0 in 1952, 134.6 in 1953, and 151.4 in 1954.

In other words, for every 100 white children born in 1939 and starting school in 1946, there will be 151 starting school in 1954. For every 100 non-white children born in 1939 and starting school in 1946 there will be about 134 starting school in 1954.

The artificial breeding program is making progress in Union County. The association now has 241 members and between 1,500 and 1,600 cows signed up.
