Teachers In Training Use Town Resources

Teachers in training at Young Harris College this summer are participating in a professional program which integrates the use of art, music, children's literature, and community resources in the teaching procedures.

Prospective teachers work together to select problem areas and develop a program on the elementary level which will incorporate all creative activities.

Teacher training officials point out that one group is working on the problem of maintaining physical, mental, and emotional health on the elementary level. In connection with this problem the prospective teachers will carry out activities such as painting of a mural which depicts various health services. They will utilize the service of a member of the Young Harris staff for aid in this. They will receive the aid of a member of the music staff who will help them with public school music dealing with health. The development of a rhythm band and the practice of folk games will lend to the development of aesthetic appreciation.

In the selection of health literature for children the members of the Towns-Union Regional Library staff are utilized, thus developing an understanding of community resources on the part of prospective teachers.

Theory of methods enter into the picture as a means toward an end according to Starr Miller, director of teacher education, who points out that this is only one unit in the Young Harris Plan for teacher education.
