## Missionary Speaks Here Friday Night

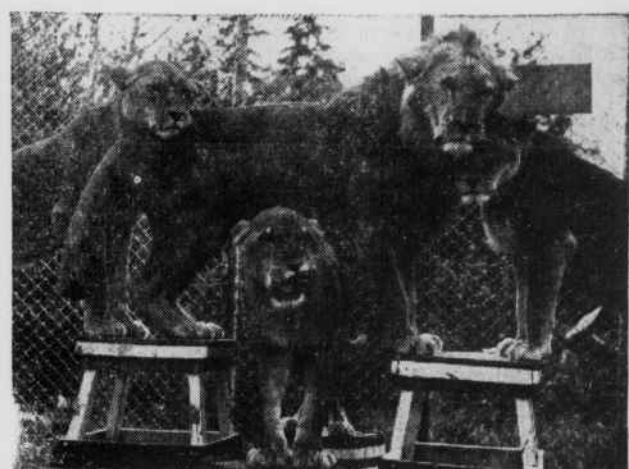
