ALL TAX PAYERS will take notice that the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, North Carolina, will sit as a Board of Equalization and Review at its office in the Courthouse in Murphy, North Carolina, for the purpose of hearing any complaints or protests as to over-valuation or under-valuation of real property, beginning July 30th, 1948.

"Notice of An Election To Determine Whether Or Not Beer And Wine Shall Be Legally Sold In Cherokee County"

Notice is hereby given that an election had been called and will be held at and in the several voting precincts of Cherokee County, North Carolina on the 31st day of August, 1948 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the county the question of the legal sale of both wine and beer in said county.

Notice is further given that the registration books for the said election will be open at the several precincts at the usual polling places on Saturday the 7th, 14th, and 21st days of August, 1948, from 9 A.M. until sunset, during the registration period, and that on all other week days the registration books will be available for register-

ing persons during the same hours at the homes or places of business of the registrars.

That challenges will be received at the polling place on Saturday the 28th day of August, 1948 from 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

That the ballot for said election shall contain as follows:

- () For the Legal Sale of Wine
- () Against the Legal Sale of Wine
- () For the Legal Sale of Beer
- () Against the Legal Sale of Beer

That if a majority of the votes in such Election shall be against the sale of Wine and/or Beer, then after the expiration of sixty (60) days from the day on which the Election is held it shall be unlawful to sell or possess for the purpose of sale in the County wine and beer. If the majority of votes cast in this election shall be for the legal sale of wine and/or beer, then the sale of same shall be legal.

That said Election shall be held and the votes cast, canvassed, certified and declared under the same rules and regulations governing the holding of General Election as now provided by law, except that no absentee votes shall be received and counted in said Election.

A New County wide Registration will be called when the Registration Books are open for the Beer and Wine Election.
