Both programs consisted of musical numbers.

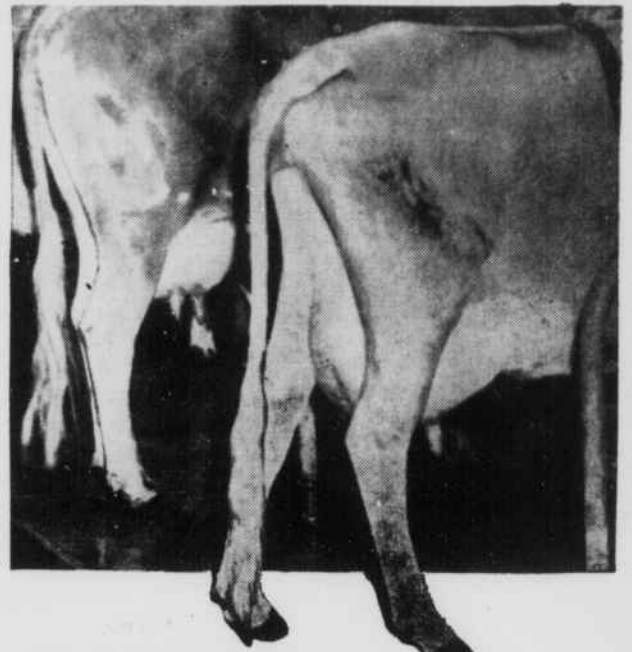
This program was sponsored by Mrs. Florence Huffman, sixth grade teacher.
