"Inasmuch as Dr. George W Truett was one of the greatest Baptist preachers of all time and masmuch as Divine Providence permitted him to be born in beautiful Western North Carolina in a hills of Clay county along side a mountain stream;

"And inasmuch as this property belongs to the Baptists of North South every year,

"Therefore, be it resolved that we petition and request the General Board to refrain from moving the building from its present location to an entirely new location with new surroundings.
