Mrs. Emma Tate

The journey of life lies along the dark valley of the shadow of death. There is no spot on its pilgrimage where his presence is unknown. Mrs. Tate admired those ideals that were elevating and was frank in her expressions toward that end. She was, until she became disabled, a constant church attendant giving liberally of her limited means. 'Twas but a year ago she was more faithful in attending a revival night and early morning than many who were younger and far more able than she, to attend.

In the last days of her illness she seemed to have lived in a spiritual world, and her inner self saw only the beautiful. She would remark "How beautiful everything seems, and everybody has been so good". She had relinquished her hold on anything earthly and all was ethereal. Like the plant that ceases at a certain stage to draw substance from the soil, but depends upon pollination for nurture, she too ceased to accept the curative elements of a physical world and was nurtured by the Holy Spirit and fell peacefully to sleep.

Truly we shall have her with us no more, but let us be consoled with this thought, that she has passed the glittering splendors and burnished systems that flash from the jeweled arch of the midnight; passed from death unto life, from great trials and tribulations unto perfect rest, and has joined beyond the golden bars her loved and lost, and is chanting upon a golden harp the sweet refrain of triumph. She is wearing by the crystal river the victor's crown of life.
