### 7,483 New Cars Sold In May

Nearly twice as many new cars were brought into North Carolina during May as in the same month last year but the number of trucks sold was on the decline, the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles reports. During May 7,483 new cars were sold in North Carolina as compared with 4,519 last year. Trucks sold numbered 1,817, a drop from the 2,655 sold in the same month last year. The May sales brought to 31,964 the number of new cars sold this year and 9,412 the number of trucks. Chevrolet led car sales with 1,905. Ford was second with 1,354. In truck sales Chevrolet outstripped other vehicles with 704 sales. Ford sold 461 and Dodge, 215. Mecklenburg residents bought the largest number of new cars—643; Guilford was second with 491 and Wake was third with 352. Truck sales were as follows: Mecklenburg, 100; Guilford, 94; Wake, 75.

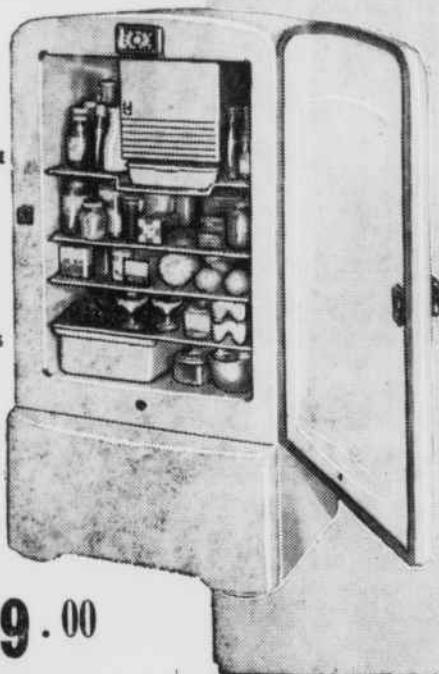
