## Health Department To Conduct Typhoid Clinics

The Cherokee County Health Department plans to conduct typhoid clinics throughout the County within the next six weeks. It is hoped that everyone who has not been immunized against typhoid within the past three years will take advantage of this opportunity.

Three doses of typhoid serum are necessary to immunize the individual. Following is a schedule of the time and places clinics will be held:

## Water Safety Instructor Course Of Red Cross Starts Monday

### Work Progressing On Schedule On U. S. Highway 19

Contractors report "on schedule" progress in the relocation of U. S. Highways 19 and 129 southwest of Murphy.

The \$174,090 project is designed to improve the trafficway from the Georgia line to U. S. Highway 64, a route which carries a heavy volume of motor flow between Murphy, Blairsville, and Atlanta, Ga.

Asheville Contracting company, of Asheville, holds the contract award.

The firm is a member of the Carolina branch, Associated General Contractors of America.

In their progress report, officials said that the grading and drainage work has been completed on the 3.82 miles of the relocated right-of-way, and that 65 per cent or more of the traffic-bound macadam base course has been laid.

The contract also calls for bituminous surface treatment of the entire length.

Resident Engineer F. L. Hutchison of Murphy and Division Engineer W. M. Corkill of Asheville are supervising the project for the State Highway and Public Works commission.

The Marble Baptist Church will dedicate its new Church Building Sunday, July 16, with an all-day homecoming program.

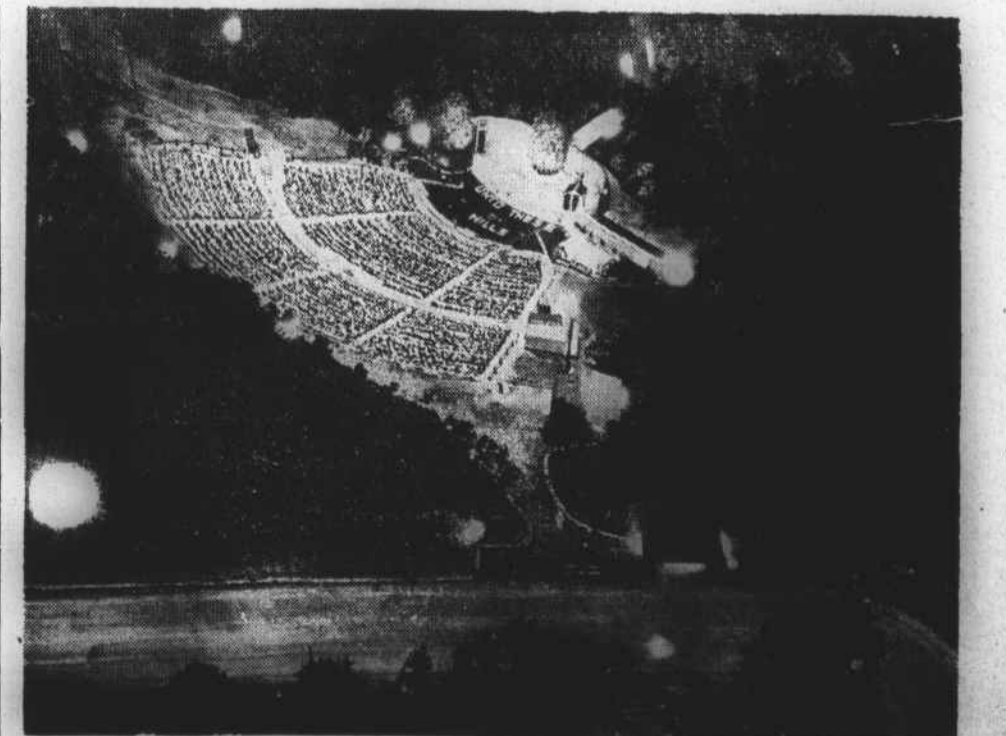
All former pastors and members are cordially invited to be present. This will be the first service held by the Church.
