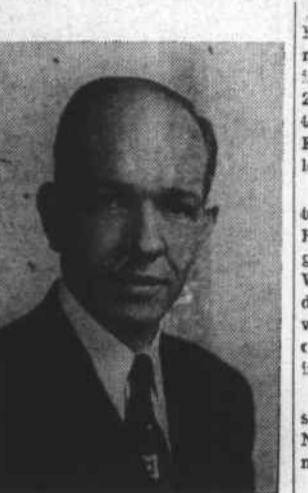
Lions See Show On "Theological Education"
