As of July 1, 1050, Cherokee county had 352.68 miles of distri-bution lines which were serving 2,-To Meet 25th 094 consumers. Clay county had 131 miles of distribution lines serving 1,147 consumers.

In these two adjoining counties a total of nearly 500 miles of distribution lines carries current to over 3,000 consumers. In the entire state approximately nine out of ten rural families, farm and

uon-farm, now have electricity. In 1935 3.2% of the farms were electrified. As of July 1, 1950 88.6% of the farms are electuified. Compared with North Carolina, the per centage of farms in the entire United States that are electrified is 66.3%. The N. C. R. E. A. estimate that 254,568 farms in the state are supplied with electricity.

Ditches Dug With Dynamite

Six men made a ditch 625 feet long near here in two hours recent 'y. They used dynamite and "shot" the ditch on Burton Cornwell's farm on Martins' Creek across a riece of land that has been use less for years. It required 250 pounds of dynamite which was worth \$75.

County Extension Agents with the Extension Engineering Specialist, Howard Ellis, demonstrat ed to two groups of farmers jast week. They state that blasting ditches with dynamite can be the cheapest, easiest and certainly the suickest method of draining wet land.

This method is especially suit able for open ditches as it leaves a "V" shaped ditch which can be mowed to control growth of weeds and shrubs. There is no ridge of soil along the bank.
