# Ben Webb Drowns On Lake Nantahala

Webb was drowned Sunday afternoon about 2 o'clock when a boat from which he was fishing capsized on Lake Nantahala. Three companions in the boat reached rafety. They were Luther Lemons of Andrews, who was admitted to Rodda-VanGorder Hospital suffering from shock, and Elbert Gibby and Jess Mashburn, Jr., also of An-

Lemons stated that when the boat overturned he started swimming to reach it and did not remember anything else until he regained consciousness while in a car on the way to the hospital.

The body was recovered Sunday night about 9 o'clock in approximately 75 feet of water near the spot where the boat overturned.

He is survived by the widow, the former Miss Jane Clark; the parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Webb of Andrews; two sisters, Mrs. Jack Garner of Andrews and Miss Ann Webb of Chattanooga, Tenn.: and two brothers, Gene with the U.S. Army in Kores and Sam with the U. S. Army in California.

#### Jas. R. Dillingham On Korean Front

WITH THE FIRST CAVALRY DIVISION, U. S. ARMY, IN KO-REA-(Delayed)- Private James R Dillingham, son of Mrs. Julia T. Dillingham, of Andrews, is on the Korean front fighting with the 61st Field Artillery Battalion.

Pvt. Dilkingham's battalion has lobbed more than 100,000 high explosive 105-milimeter shells into the Communist forces, killing 10,estimated 40,000 in more than nine months of rugged fighting.

The 61st Artillery, which is one of four howitzer units in the 1st Cavalry Division, was the unit that once fought in front of American infantry and repulsed a powerful cnemy attack.

Near Pakelion in North Korea. the 500-man battalion was ahead J. A. Rousseau of North Wilkes- of friendly infantry, preparing to bombard Communist positions, when a huge Red force swept down on the gun positions.

> Cooks, clerks and mechanics dug in around the guns and fought a vicious battle against an estimated 2,000-man Communist attacking force.

Pvt. Dillingham's battalion funcitons in Korea on the credo of "Infantrymen as well as Artillerymen." There have been numerous frontline forays in which gunners picked up their rifles and fought

the enemy at close range. The battalion fired its first angry round into the Communist on July 22, 1950, and in the ensuing drews, Rt. 1; Luther Killian, Mur- 24 hours, blasted the enemy with more than 3,000 shells.
