

Funeral Is Held For Carl Cook

The death of Carl Cook, 34, of Robbinsville, whose body was recovered Wednesday about 6:30 p. m. in Lake Santee, was attributed to a heart attack, a Graham County coroner's jury ruled Thursday. Coroner Sam Sharp said.

Cook went with three companions, Horace and Hubert Queen, and Hubert Roberson of Robbinsville on a camping trip to the lake. While the three men were setting up camp, Cook went out in a boat to catch some fish. A man on the opposite side of the lake saw him fall into the lake and about 4 o'clock called to his companions. The body was recovered by Ed McKeldry of Robbinsville.

Funeral services were held Friday at 10 a. m. in Old Mother Church in Robbinsville. The Rev. Joe L. Orr officiated, and burial was in the church cemetery with full military rites by the Robbinsville Post of the American Legion.

Cook was a veteran of World War II and had been taking G. I. training in mechanics.
