## Hall Speaks On Pedestrian Safety

Last Tuesday the Rev. Wm. E. Hall, pastor of St. Andrews Lutheran Church, Andrews, spoke to the Andrews school children on safety. Being appalled by the number of traffic accidents lately, particularly those involving children playing in the street, he spoke to them about the "Ten Commandment of Pedestrian Safety."

Using his dog "Susie", he showed the children that while she knew a great many things and could do many tricks, she was not careful as a pedestrian. He showed them how she was careless about crossing streets, playing in the street, not looking before she went for her ball.

Mr. Hall said that she would not walk on the proper side of a highway approaching cars and that her black color was hard to see at night. Then he showed them how she should wear something light so she could be easily seen at night.

He concluded by telling the children that there is not much point in knowing a great many things if they are not going to watch for cars, because they probably will not live long enough to use the knowledge.
