"Boycott Is An Ugly Word"

I received a circular letter through the mail Feb. 4. This letter was headed as Murphy Citizens Legal Control Committee. There were no names telling of whom this committee is composed but it was signed at the bottom by Fred V. Johnson

I am answering this letter through THE CHEROKEE SCOUT because I have not seen a list of the Legal Control Committee and therefore cannot write to each one individually.

I want to speak briefly of this first word, "Boycott". This letter that used the word "Boycott" has been composed by an expert, but he is using a Bad Word in a Bad Place and in a Bad Way.
