Miss Snyder reported that more than 4,500 people saw the films in the October collection and she said "we expect this new lot to be even more popular."

She also said, "Since we are circulating the films in all three counties served by the Nantahala Regional Library, we have to take bookings on a first come, first serve basis. Make your reservation early if you want to be assured of your first choice."

Most popular films in the collection were Dare, Birthplace of America, Yours is the Land, and Booker T. Washington.

Films which will be available from Nov. 10 through Dec. 5 include the following:

**BE SAFE HOME**—12 minutes, black and white. A busy day in the life of a typical American family and the many little things that cause accidents. The picture offers suggestions on how every member of the family can help prevent accidents.

**JAPAN AND DEMOCRACY**—10 minutes, black and white. A report on the program of the United States for educating the people of Japan, and the impact of democracy on the life of a typical Japanese family. Also, Japan's post-war freedom, and indicates the nation's continuing economic and cultural problems.
