In the third period, Robbinsville also took to the air and a 23 yard pass from Howell to Birchfield placed the ball on the Andrews 2 yard line. Gordon Howell

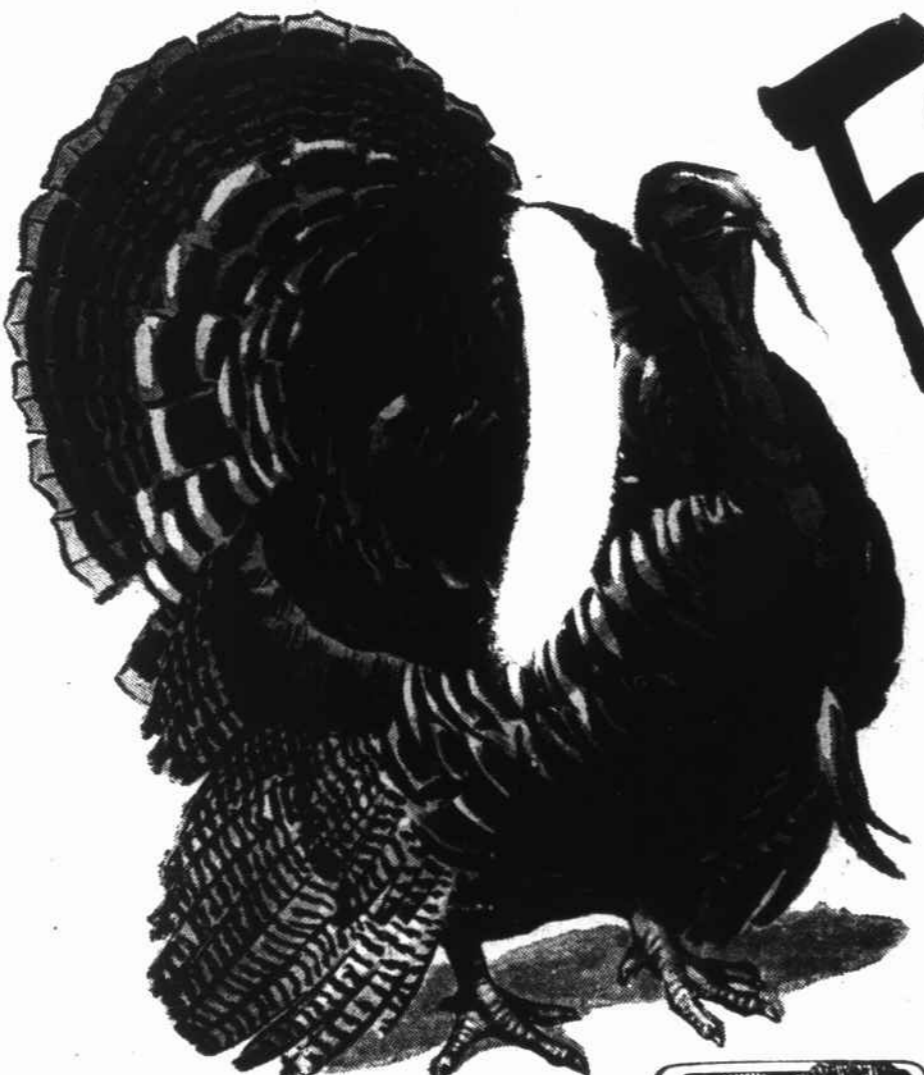
Miss Derreberry was presented a miniature football by the co-captain of the team.

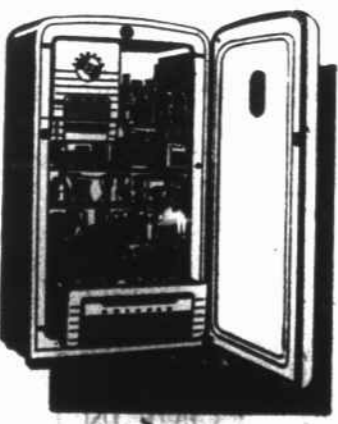
